CIVIL RIGHTS ACT OF 1964

The Louisville Metro Police Department provides equal opportunity in all programs.

Title VI and its related nondiscrimination authorities collectively state that “no person shall, on the grounds of race, color or national origin, sex, age, or disability be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under” any of LMPD’s programs or activities.
